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
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
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# Royal Wolverhampton NHS Trust - public health and school nursing services

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
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# West Midlands Police




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

Their Specialist Education Mental Health Practitioners are also equipped to offer more complex and high-intensity treatment when needed. By partnering with Reflexions, we ensure that our pupils receive the comprehensive mental health support they need to thrive both academically and personally. This collaboration helps us create a nurturing and supportive school environment where every student can achieve their full potential.

At Stow Heath Primary School, we prioritise the mental health and emotional well-being of our pupils. To support this commitment, we collaborate with the Child and Adolescent Mental Health Services (CAMHS), specifically their Child and Family Service, which works alongside our Mental Health Lead (MHL) and school staff to identify, discuss, and plan for the mental health needs of our students. The Child and Family Service within CAMHS is a specialist service for children who present with severe and enduring mental health difficulties. These can include depression, anxiety, severe self-harm, suicidal intent, and hearing voices. Some of these young people may also have specific learning difficulties, such as dyslexia, but do not have a learning disability. By partnering with CAMHS, we ensure that our pupils receive the comprehensive mental health support they need to manage severe and long-term challenges. This collaboration helps us create a nurturing and supportive school environment where every student can achieve their full potential.

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

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
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# Educational Psychologist

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

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
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# Wolverhampton Grand Theatre

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
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# Good Shepherd Foodbank

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
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# ConnectEd Partnerships

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
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# NSPCC

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

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
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
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# Red Nose Day

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

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
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# Freshwater Theatre

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
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# World Wide Fund for Nature
