- School visits – support for FSM pupils on year 6 and year 2 overnight stays
- Teaching assistant support in all classrooms during am session to support learning across the curriculum
- Teaching assistant support in all year group during pm session to support learning across the curriculum and support access for all pupils
- Coaching and mentoring from SLT, to improve the quality of teaching to good
- Release time for Literacy coordinator to develop literacy across school
